

Surely, spring is just around the corner. And the Widows Home has been getting a jump start on spring cleaning. All around the Home, you'll notice nice updates...

Staff members have moved their offices around to be more accessible to residents, family members and staff. Most have had a fresh coat of paint and updated signage as well. We now have Medical Records in a big, bright office upstairs and are regularly using the 2nd floor conference room.

You may not have noticed, but the basement of our building has undergone an overhaul. Goodwill Easter Seals received a massive donation from us of approximately 75 boxes and bags of home decor, supplies, books and old records, clothing and more. At least 20 pieces of slightly damaged furniture was included in the donation, along with at least 25 old tv's and computers. Goodwill will recycle, refurbish and sell these items in their stores with proceeds benefiting their non-profit programs.

Unused mattresses have been donated to St. Vincent's for their shelters, and a stack of old wheelchairs and medical equipment will be donated to and refurbished by Goodwill's medical equipment loan program for those in need.

You'll notice some new "old" furniture around the Home as well. Some lovely pieces of antique furniture were brought up from the basement to adorn the Home. You'll find pieces in the front lobby, the "bird room" (the Shaw), the dining room, and in the administrator's office. As most of these items would have once belonged to widows living in their Home, they are an important part of our history and we're happy to have them on display again.
